



The Christian's Conflicting Desires

Read: Philippians 1:1-26

His statement of longing for Christ to be glorified in him whether he lives or dies (Philippians 1:20) prompts Paul to "think out loud," as it were, about the prospect of life and death in today's passage. Specifically, the apostle considers whether it would be better to go on for many more years in this world or to pass at once into glory, illustrating the conflicting desires within the heart of every believer.

On the one hand, living many years gives us almost countless opportunities to serve Jesus in this fallen world and bring great blessings to the brethren (v. 22a). In Paul's specific case, this meant a reunion with the Philippian church and work that was "necessary" for their spiritual maturity (vv. 24–26). For the apostle to have been taken to heaven soon after writing this epistle would have been, from a limited earthly perspective, a disadvantage to the



Philippians, who, from what Paul could see at the time, needed some face-to-face guidance.

On the other hand, physical death puts the Christian in a far better position, at least in the believer's own experience. Simply put, to breathe our last is to enter the very presence of Christ Jesus (v. 23). The emphasis here is not so much on the cessation of earthly difficulties, although that is one of the blessings that attends face-to-face life before our Saviour (Revelations 21). Instead, the focus is on the joys that come with experiencing the unmediated presence of the One who bought us with His own blood. We cannot even begin to describe the glories of that day.

Being in Jesus gives our entire existence meaning and purpose, just as it drove everything that Paul did on earth. Dying brings us great gain — the joys of communion with our Lord unhindered by sin. Living, however, is a great advantage as well, enabling us to bring glory to Christ among the nations. John Chrysostom writes, "One must not suppose that [Paul] is demeaning this life. . . There can be profit even here, if we live not toward this life finally but toward that other" (*Ancient Christian Commentary on Scripture*, NT vol. 8, p. 217).





Pray for the Gulf states and their surrounding region during this time of heightened tension. May the Lord grant wisdom and restraint to national leaders and security forces, that they would seek peace and justice rather than retaliation or violence.

Lift up the relationships between neighbouring nations, asking for reconciliation where trust has been strained. Pray for God's grace to prevail, bringing peace and healing to an already troubled world.

Pray for the Diocese of Singapore

September marks our Diocesan Education month. Let us pray for our school principals and senior leadership team, that they may have wisdom and courage to lead the team in fulfilling our education mission and in promoting Christian values in our schools amidst changing societal values.

Pray for the well-being of our teachers and support staff as they labour tirelessly in their roles and responsibilities; for the chaplaincy teams in their ministry among students and staff, and that God will open doors of opportunity for them to share the Gospel.

Pray for the students to have good emotional and mental health, wisdom in their academic studies; that they will grow up to be positive, resilient servant leaders in their generation.

We pray for our Chaplaincy ministry this week. Pray for Rev Eric who is the Chaplain IC as he leads the Chaplaincy team. Pray for all our associate chaplains in Simei and Bedok as they continue to minister to the staff and patients. Pray for God to bless the team and their families as they serve others.

God, who in generous mercy sent the Holy Spirit upon your Church in the burning fire of your love: grant that your people may be fervent in the fellowship of the gospel that, always abiding in you, they may be found steadfast in faith and active in service; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

The Diocese of Singapore remembers our Education Mission every September, marking it our Diocese Education Month.



Children's Ministry Children's Day Celebration – 5 Oct 2025 (Sun)



Topic : What Does it Matter?
Text : Philippians 1:1-26

Background of Philippi Church

To understand book of Philippians, read Acts 16. This was Paul's 2nd missionary journey where he had a dream, and crossed from Asia to Europe. He headed straight for Philippi.

At the time of writing, Paul was under house arrest and he was writing a letter that is so full of joy!

What is the secret to his joy in suffering?

The secret to joy is in the attitude of the mind!

God used Paul to share the gospel to Caesar's household and elite guards 3 things even when he is in adverse circumstances.

1. CHAINS (V12 – 14)

(A) Contact with the Lost

Paul was chained to the Roman guards 24 hours/day who are on 6-hour shift.

vs 13 - "ALL of them heard..."

(B) Courage to the Saved

Because of what happened to Paul, the believers in Rome found new courage.

vs 14 – "...and most of the brothers in the Lord, having become confident by my chains, are much more bold to speak the word without fear..."

2. <u>CRITICS</u> (V15 – 19)

There were 2 groups of people who are preaching because of Paul's imprisonment:

- 1. Those Who Are <u>Inspired</u> His Friends
- 2. Those Who Are <u>Insincere</u> His Critics

V18 – "What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is preached; and in this I rejoice, yes, and will rejoice..."

3. <u>CRISIS</u> (V20 – 30)

Crisis is when we see who Christ is.

Who or what are you living for?

CONCLUSION:

What is the focus of your life?

There is no higher purpose for living than Christ and His Gospel!

1) digibank Mobile

- Log in to digibank Mobile with your **Touch / Face ID** or **digibank User ID & PIN**.
- Tap Pay & Transfer and select Local.
- Select the **Recipient** you wish to transfer to: (For Recipient's list refer to Add a Recipient)

- Select the **Fund Source** you wish to transfer from (e.g. saving account) and enter the **Amount** you wish to transfer
- Enter your tithe number in 'Reference'
- Tap **Next** to review the details, and tap **Transfer Now** to complete the transfer.

2) Via Paynow

- Select 'PAYNOW' in your banking app
- Bank will send you a 6 digits OTP
- Key in the UEN T08CC4074CEC1 / T08CC4074CCMF / T08CC4074CGF2
- Key in the amount to be transferred.
- Key in your **Tithe number** in the 'Reference' space
- Click 'Transfer'



- Bank will send a text message to you that the amount has been transferred.
- You can send this message to church office.

3) DBS/POSB ATM

- Insert your ATM/Debit Card and key in your PIN.
- Press Button for More Services.
- Press Button for "Funds Transfer/Fixed Deposit".
- Select the Account Type to Debit (your own bank account)
- Select the saving account type and number to Credit

- Enter the amount.
- Verify the Details of the Transaction and press Confirm.

4) digibank Online

- Open ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select Transfer and click Other DBS or POSB Account.
- Log in with your 6-Digit iB Secure PIN.
- Choose the **Recipient** you wish to transfer your money to.
- Select the **Account** you wish to transfer from.
- Select the Currency and indicate the Amount you wish to transfer.
- Click Next.
- To transfer to a particular payee, you will need to have him/her in your recipient's list.

Adding a recipient to your list.

- Open the ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select **Transfer** and click **Add New DBS or POSB Recipient** and complete the **Authentication Process**.
- Indicate the **Recipient's name** and **Account number**, click **Next**.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and follow the **2-Factor Authentication Instructions**.
- Click **Submit** to complete the request.

Digibank Online allows you to set a monthly transfer on desired date.
