

God of the Impossible

Read: 1 Kings 17:17-24

By the time we meet up with Elijah in 1 Kings 17:17-24, it's hard not to think of this line, "And the hits just keep on coming!" After several miracles and death-defying adventures, the son of the widow he just rescued becomes deathly ill. Elijah watches his little friend go through the dying process. Surprisingly, the widow blames the prophet for her son's death. For Elijah, the hits just keep on coming.

How do we respond when we get a tongue lashing we don't deserve? Step into defense mode? Return the verbal garbage with garbage of our own? Hurt people tend to hurt people, and Elijah gets wounded here. But he doesn't seek to wound back. He does speak, but not to the woman's



tortured logic and agonized questions. Rather, he offers her gentle service and simple burden sharing. Then he gets alone with God and cries out to him for help (1 Kings 17:20), offering up an impossible prayer: "O Lord my God, let this boy's life return to him!" (1 Kings 17:21b).

It's one thing to pray for the weather, as Elijah has recently done. It's another thing to pray for the restoration of life to a dead body. That's something new. But not only does Elijah pray the impossible prayer, he's willing to be ceremonially "unclean" in the process by stretching himself out on the boy three times (1 Kings 17:21a). It was a form of sacrificial intercession in the face of a desperate situation. Happily, the Lord heard Elijah's cry, and the boy's life returned to him (1 Kings 17:22). It's the first resurrection of Scripture. Thankfully, it's not the last.

How do we face an impossible situation today? Like Elijah, we can get alone with God. We can pour out our problems to the Lord. We can strive for patient endurance and calm assurance amid the hits. And we can wait for God to act, receiving his deliverance in due course. Like Elijah, we can be fully persuaded that hope never dies because the God of the impossible lives.



Pray for the World

Transnational Organized Crime: Cybercrime & Human Trafficking. Amid the spread of industry-scale scam compounds in Cambodia, Myanmar, Laos and Thailand, often linked to criminal networks from China, call on the Lord of Hosts to rescue those who are tricked, trafficked and tortured to scam others. Implore Him to (a) expose and break the power of evildoers behind cybercrime and modern slavery (Ps 10:15); (b) advance awareness, coordination and countermeasures to bring justice and restoration for victims, both trafficked and scammed. Cry out for repentance in nations enabling such syndicates, and for Christ's light to dismantle darkness.

Pray for Singapore

Vaping and Addiction Crisis. Call upon our mighty and merciful Father to intervene in the surge of synthetic drug-laced vaping, asking Him to expose lies, awaken public awareness and shift permissive attitudes. As laws and enforcement catch up with the scale of the vaping crisis, pray for His wisdom to guide lawmakers, enforcers, educators and counsellors with swift, effective solutions. Pray for restored family bonds and communication, and His grace for vulnerable youths to manage negative emotions and encounter Christ, who sets captives free (Isa 61:1; Luke 4:18).

Pray for SACC

We pray for our local Mission, The Friend Space @ Tampines Mart. We commit to support this outreach initiative in our finances, our participation and our prayers. We ask that God will use this work to bring more souls into His Kingdom. We also pray for our overseas Mission in Cambodia. We pray for the student hostel in Pursat and the surrounding churches that we have been supporting. We pray for our Clay Youths who will be going for a Mission Trip to Cambodia in late November.




Collect - 8th Sunday After Trinity

Topic : When Tragedy Strikes
Text : 1 Kings 17:17 - 24

INTRODUCTION:

In the first two miracles, God was the one taking all the initiative.

Now God is about to teach Elijah how to exercise faith for himself when tragedies come knocking.

Philippians 4: 11 – 13, Daniel 3: 18, Esther 4: 15, Habakkuk 3; 17-18

WHAT WAS ELIJAH'S RESPONSE?

1. HE PRESENTED THE PROBLEM TO GOD (vs 19)

Elijah's first response was: "Give me your son..."

In times of tragedies, it is not how you explain it but how you handle it that matters.

2. HE PERSEVERED IN PRAYER BEFORE GOD (vs 20a)

Then he cried out to the Lord...

Process of effective intercession:

- 1. Inquire
- 2. Identify

Between our prayer and God's answer; there is a period of waiting.

And this period is the trial of faith. (Hebrews 5: 7)

3. HE PROCLAIMED THE POWER OF GOD (vs 20b)

Elijah declared: "O Lord my God, let the boy's life return to him..."

1 Kings 17: 22 – "The Lord heard Elijah's cry..."

CONCLUSION:

The widow declared "Now, I know that you are a man of God and that the word of the Lord from your mouth is the truth..." (vs 24)

Transferring of Tithe/Offering via DBS/POSB banking platform

1) digibank Mobile

- Log in to digibank Mobile with your Touch / Face ID or digibank User ID & PIN.
- Tap Pay & Transfer and select Local.
- Select the **Recipient** you wish to transfer to: (For Recipient's list refer to Add a Recipient)

- Select the **Fund Source** you wish to transfer from (e.g. saving account) and enter the **Amount** you wish to transfer
- Enter your tithe number in 'Reference'
- Tap **Next** to review the details, and tap **Transfer Now** to complete the transfer.

2) Via Paynow

- Select 'PAYNOW' in your banking app
- Bank will send you a 6 digits OTP
- Key in the UEN T08CC4074CEC1 / T08CC4074CCMF / T08CC4074CGF2
- Key in the amount to be transferred.
- Key in your **Tithe number** in the 'Reference' space
- Click 'Transfer'
- Bank will send a text message to you that the amount has been transferred.
- You can send this message to church office.



3) DBS/POSB ATM

- Insert your ATM/Debit Card and key in your PIN.
- Press Button for **More Services**.
- Press Button for "Funds Transfer/Fixed Deposit".
- Select the Account Type to Debit (your own bank account)
- Select the saving account type and number to Credit

- Enter the amount.
- Verify the Details of the Transaction and press Confirm.
- Key in your tithe number under reference/bill or send a text to the church office of the transaction: Date of transfer; tithe & amount

4) digibank Online

- Open ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select **Transfer** and click **Other DBS or POSB Account**.
- Log in with your 6-Digit iB Secure PIN.
- Choose the Recipient you wish to transfer your money to.
- Select the **Account** you wish to transfer from.
- Select the **Currency** and indicate the **Amount** you wish to transfer.
- Click Next.
- To transfer to a particular payee, you will need to have him/her in your recipient's list.

Adding a recipient to your list.

- Open the ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select Transfer and click Add New DBS or POSB Recipient and complete the Authentication Process.
- Indicate the Recipient's name and Account number, click Next.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and follow the **2-Factor Authentication Instructions**.
- Click **Submit** to complete the request.

Digibank Online allows you to set a monthly transfer on desired date.
