

Elijah and the Prophets of Baal

Read: 1 Kings 18:16-40

The context for this event is the syncretistic worship of the old covenant community. King Ahab ruled about 150 years after David, and by that time, the northern kingdom of Israel was practicing the very evil that the Israelites were supposed to have driven out of the land, namely, idolatry. Under the patronage of Queen Jezebel, prophets of the Canaanite high god Baal had carte blanche to do what they wanted in Israel (1 Kings 19:1–2). These prophets brought paganism to the ancient Israelites and gave false comfort to the royal court. For his opposition to this pagan worship and the kings who endorsed it, Elijah was labelled the "troubler of Israel" by Ahab (18:17). But the prophet was only doing what the faithful people of God always do, and that is live at peace with others unless and until a response to idolatry is needed.



This sparked a confrontation between Elijah and the false prophets on Mount Carmel. There, before the people of Israel, Elijah called the nation to choose whom it would serve: the Lord or Baal. It was not possible for them to serve both or to be double-minded (vv. 20–21). Of course, this is a theme that appears throughout the prophets and, indeed, the rest of the Bible. God is not interested in half-hearted commitment. He will either have our hearts in their entirety, or He will have nothing to do with us at all (Joshua 24:15; Psalm 119:113; Matthew 6:24; John 14:6).

From a human perspective, Elijah did not have the upper hand. He was outnumbered by the false prophets of Baal. However, that did not stop him from confronting them. We are familiar with the account of each side building an altar to its deity and calling down fire from heaven to prove which one was the true God. Elijah did everything possible to prove that Yahweh was God; he even soaked the sacrifices and built a moat so that only a powerful fire from heaven could consume the offering. That consuming fire is exactly what came for his sacrifice (vv. 22–40). Grounded in the Word of the Lord and trusting fully in His power, Elijah stood down a powerful enemy and testified to divine truth.



Pray for the World

We lift up in prayer the ongoing war between Ukraine and Russia, and ask for the Lord's divine intervention as Ukraine proposes new peace talks. May God move the hearts of the leaders toward humility, compassion and compromise and that a genuine peace settlement may be reached and their citizens may finally begin to heal and rebuild their lives.

Pray for Singapore

As Singapore turns 60, we give thanks for God's faithful hand over our nation. May He continue to lead us to turn fully towards Him, with hearts that seek Him first in every season. We pray for a generation of young people to rise up—rooted in truth, and ready to carry the gospel into every sphere of society. May we be a people marked by love, generosity, and courage, always ready to bless the nations beyond our shores. We ask the Lord for strong and lasting friendships on the global stage, and for leaders in our government who are upright, discerning, and committed to the good of the nation.

Pray for SACC

We thank God for our Sunday School teachers, who volunteer their time and energy to sow seeds of truth into the lives of our children. We lift them to the Lord, praying for renewed strength, deep joy, and fresh creativity to engage the children in ways that bring Scripture to life. May their labour never feel in vain, and may they know how deeply valued they are. We also pray for the parents of these children that they, too, would embrace their role in this ministry, teaching their children the ways of the Lord at home, so that together, we raise a generation that knows, loves, and follows God.




Collect - 9th Sunday After Trinity

1) digibank Mobile

- Log in to digibank Mobile with your Touch / Face ID or digibank User ID & PIN.
- Tap Pay & Transfer and select Local.
- Select the **Recipient** you wish to transfer to: (For Recipient's list refer to Add a Recipient)

- Select the Fund Source you wish to transfer from (e.g. saving account) and enter the Amount you wish to transfer
- Enter your tithe number in 'Reference'
- Tap **Next** to review the details, and tap **Transfer Now** to complete the transfer.

2) Via Paynow

- Select 'PAYNOW' in your banking app
- Bank will send you a 6 digits OTP
- Key in the UEN T08CC4074CEC1 / T08CC4074CCMF / T08CC4074CGF2
- Key in the amount to be transferred.
- Key in your **Tithe number** in the 'Reference' space
- Click 'Transfer'
- Bank will send a text message to you that the amount has been transferred.
- You can send this message to church office.



3) **DBS/POSB ATM**

- Insert your ATM/Debit Card and key in your PIN.
- Press Button for More Services.
- Press Button for "Funds Transfer/Fixed Deposit".
- Select the Account Type to Debit (your own bank account)
- Select the saving account type and number to Credit

- Enter the amount.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and press **Confirm**.

digibank Online 4)

- Open ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select Transfer and click Other DBS or POSB Account.
- Log in with your 6-Digit iB Secure PIN.
- Choose the **Recipient** you wish to transfer your money to.
- Select the **Account** you wish to transfer from.
- Select the **Currency** and indicate the **Amount** you wish to transfer.
- Click Next.
- To transfer to a particular payee, you will need to have him/her in your recipient's list.

Adding a recipient to your list.

- Open the ibanking portal, login with your User ID and PIN.
- Select Transfer and click Add New DBS or POSB Recipient and complete the Authentication Process.
- Indicate the Recipient's name and Account number, click Next.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and follow the **2-Factor Authentication Instructions**.
- Click **Submit** to complete the request.

Digibank Online allows you to set a monthly transfer on desired date.
