



A Mission-shaped Church

Read: Luke 10: 1-9

What does it mean for us to be a mission-shaped church and to share the Gospel to the wider community in both word and deed?

Luke 10 is a story about Jesus sending out his followers into mission. Before he sent them, he would want to give them strong words of encouragement and to stir up their spirits and fill them with a sense of joy and hope for the mission journey that lay ahead. But he doesn't do that, I'm afraid: in fact, his approach seems really puzzling...

What did he say? "The harvest is plentiful. But the labourers are few". Not exactly motivating. He compounded the problem further by saying, "Go on your way! I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves", and "Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals".



So what do we learn from this passage about the task of mission to which we are called?

1. Mission is a partnership activity between all of us and God

Firstly, the fact that there were 70 people reminds us of the story of Moses in the wilderness in Numbers 11. The example of Moses calling 70 helpers for the mission mirrored here in the life of Jesus as a reminder that mission and ministry is not the sole responsibility of the leader, whether that's Moses, or Jesus, or even the Vicar! No, mission and ministry is a corporate activity that we undertake together as the Body of Christ. Christian mission is the responsibility of all believers everywhere.

2. Mission requires that we be absolutely focused on the task in hand

As a church we need to be single-minded in our commitment to mission. That's why, in verse 4, Jesus says to the 70: "Greet no one on the road". So, Jesus imperative not to stop and greet anyone was not saying that they shouldn't be friendly to other people, but they needed to remain single-minded in purpose.

3. Mission is activity-based

In verse 9, Jesus exhorts his followers to say: "The Kingdom of God has come near to you".

Firstly, the sharing of hospitality, verse 7: "Eat and drink whatever they provide, do not move about from house to house..."

Second, compassion and care are signs of the Kingdom, verse 9: Jesus said, 'Cure the sick who are there". Third, proclaiming the Gospel is a sign of the Kingdom, verse 9 again: "Say to them, 'The Kingdom of God has come near to you'".



Transferring of Tithe/Offering via DBS/POSB banking platform

1) digibank Mobile

- Log in to digibank Mobile with your Touch / Face ID or digibank User ID & PIN.
- Tap Pay & Transfer and select Local.
- Select the Recipient you wish to transfer to: (For Recipient's list refer to Add a Recipient)

- Select the Fund Source you wish to transfer from (e.g. saving account) and enter the Amount you wish to transfer
- Enter your tithe number in 'Reference'
- Tap **Next** to review the details, and tap **Transfer Now** to complete the transfer.

2) Via Paynow

- Select 'PAYNOW' in your banking app
- Bank will send you a 6 digits OTP
- Key in the UEN T08CC4074CEC1 / T08CC4074CCMF / T08CC4074CGF2
- Key in the amount to be transferred.
- Key in your **Tithe number** in the 'Reference' space
- Click 'Transfer'
- Bank will send a text message to you that the amount has been transferred.
- You can send this message to church office.



3) DBS/POSB ATM

- Insert your ATM/Debit Card and key in your PIN.
- Press Button for More Services.
- Press Button for "Funds Transfer/Fixed Deposit".
- Select the Account Type to Debit (your own bank account)
- Select the saving account type and number to Credit

- Enter the amount.
- Verify the Details of the Transaction and press Confirm.
- Key in your tithe number under reference/bill or send a text to the church office of the transaction: Date of transfer; tithe & amount

4) digibank Online

- Open ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select Transfer and click Other DBS or POSB Account.
- Log in with your 6-Digit iB Secure PIN.
- Choose the Recipient you wish to transfer your money to.
- Select the **Account** you wish to transfer from.
- Select the **Currency** and indicate the **Amount** you wish to transfer.
- Click Next.
- To transfer to a particular payee, you will need to have him/her in your recipient's list.

Adding a recipient to your list.

- Open the ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select Transfer and click Add New DBS or POSB Recipient and complete the Authentication Process.
- Indicate the Recipient's name and Account number, click Next.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and follow the **2-Factor Authentication Instructions**.
- Click **Submit** to complete the request.

Digibank Online allows you to set a monthly transfer on desired date.

Follow the instruction in the 'More Services' button.
