### COLLECT FOR FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

God our creator, who in the beginning commanded the light to shine out of darkness: we pray that the light of the glorious gospel of Christ may dispel the darkness of ignorance and unbelief, shine into the hearts of all your people, and reveal the knowledge of your glory in the face of Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

## Article: What Are You Thinking About?

### Read: Philippians 4:8

In our text, Paul says we're to think about whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, and praiseworthy.

When God tells us to think about what is true, that means firstly that He wants us to focus our attention on his Word. And we know from John 14:6 that Christ is the embodiment of the truth. He is the final and complete revelation from God, from whom and through whom we can know the truth. So our Father wants us to fill our minds with his Word and with a knowledge of his Son.

When we're told to think about whatever is noble, this is a word that's often used of a person who is of good character, honourable, and respectable. For example, it's a word that's used of elders and deacons. When we're called to think about whatever is right, God is telling us to focus our attention on those things that are just, on those things that are in accordance with his laws and his character.

And then the apostle calls us to think about whatever is pure, lovely, and admirable. The word for purity speaks of what is holy, innocent, and chaste. The word for lovely refers to what is pleasing and the word for admirable describes what is worthy of praise. In a similar way, we're called to think about those things that are excellent and praiseworthy. This refers to moral excellence and to the redemptive acts and power of God, for God's works in creation and redemption are incredibly beautiful.

The point of this passage is that we focus our attention on those things that reflect God's character and on those things that come from Him.

Now if I'm not mistaken, we don't naturally do this. We often give a lot of air time in our minds to sinful thoughts. Sometimes we mentally rehash how people have hurt us. We brood over how to get rich, or we pursue lustful thoughts, or we proudly turn over in our minds how good we are at something. This isn't the way to live, because if we give these evil thoughts a place, we become corrupt – and eventually our minds will become sewers of evil thoughts.

So let's say you are convicted to think about only what is good and right. Do you think you'll be able to accomplish that? The Bible says you won't be able to do that by your own strength. We're evil by nature and our thoughts are depraved. But the good news is that Jesus Christ works this repentance and this change of thinking in his people ([Acts 5:31](#)). Christ renews our thinking so that we learn to fill our minds with the beautiful things that are from God.

Asking God to change your thinking is an important matter to pray about, because those who fill their minds with the Lord – who He is, what He has done, and the things that are true, just, pure, admirable, and beautiful – are blessed with a deep sense of his peace. So let me ask you: What will you be thinking about in this coming week?





# Transferring of Tithe/Offering via DBS/POSB banking platform

## 1) digibank Mobile

- Log in to digibank Mobile with your **Touch / Face ID** or **digibank User ID & PIN**.
- Tap **Pay & Transfer** and select **Local**.
- Select the **Recipient** you wish to transfer to: *(For Recipient's list refer to Add a Recipient)*
  - o SACC English Congregation 029-900919-2
  - o SACC Cambodia Mission Fund 106-900039-4
  - o SACC Growth Fund 106-900038-6
- Select the **Fund Source** you wish to transfer from (e.g. saving account) and enter the **Amount** you wish to transfer
- Enter your tithe number in '**Reference**'
- Tap **Next** to review the details, and tap **Transfer Now** to complete the transfer.

## 2) Via Paynow

- Select 'PAYNOW' in your banking app
- Bank will send you a 6 digits OTP
- Key in the UEN T08CC4074CEC1 / T08CC4074CCMF / T08CC4074CGF2
- Key in the amount to be transferred.
- Key in your Tithe number in the 'Reference' space
- Click 'Transfer'
- Bank will send a text message to you that the amount has been transferred.
- You can send this message to church office.

## 3) DBS/POSB ATM

- Insert your ATM/Debit Card and key in your PIN.
- Press Button for **More Services**.
- Press Button for "Funds Transfer/Fixed Deposit".
- Select the Account Type to Debit (your own bank account)
- Select the saving account type and number to Credit
  - o SACC (English) 029-900919-2
  - o SACC Cambodia Mission Fund 106-900039-4
  - o SACC Growth Fund 106-900038-6
- Enter the amount.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and press **Confirm**.
- Key in your tithe number under reference/bill or send a text to the church office of the transaction: Date of transfer; tithe & amount

## 4) digibank Online

- Open ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select **Transfer** and click **Other DBS or POSB Account**.
- Log in with your **6-Digit iB Secure PIN**.
- Choose the **Recipient** you wish to transfer your money to.
- Select the **Account** you wish to transfer from.
- Select the **Currency** and indicate the **Amount** you wish to transfer.
- Click **Next**.
- To transfer to a particular payee, you will need to have him/her in your recipient's list.

**Adding a recipient to your list.**

- Open the ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select **Transfer** and click **Add New DBS or POSB Recipient** and complete the **Authentication Process**.
- Indicate the **Recipient's name** and **Account number**, click **Next**.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and follow the **2-Factor Authentication Instructions**.
- Click **Submit** to complete the request.

Digibank Online allows you to set a monthly transfer on desired date.  
Follow the instruction in the '**More Services**' button.
