COLLECT FOR 4TH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that with you as our ruler and guide we may so pass through things temporal that we lose not our hold on things eternal; grant this, heavenly Father, for our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Article: Unified

Read: Acts 2:41-47

This passage does not advocate for communism as some teachers imply. The fact that these Christians willingly shared of their surplus and ministered directly to those in need without governmental coercion or fear of punishment is precisely what makes their generosity remarkable. It was the Holy Spirit that motivated this outpouring of generosity; not fear of a government. They were unified, they were devoted, and the Lord used them to bring about daily revivals (v. 47).

Consider the nature of the things to which they devoted themselves. They *devoted* themselves to meeting together and *devoted* themselves to the breaking of bread. The New Testament church had just been born and there was much to learn. Imagine living to see this remarkable fulfillment of prophecy and imagine what it would have been like to live as a Jew who saw first-hand this transition in the nature of worship itself; to go from abiding by apodictic and ceremonial law your

entire life and then to see worship as we know it today born. Indeed, they needed to devote themselves to teaching and to fellowship. So, they came together and were united over teaching, but the fellowship they shared and the food they ate were a big deal as well. I am convinced that food is a big deal to God and that's not just because I am a Southern Baptist. When Jesus gave us a way to remember Him, He did so by transitioning the Passover meal into the New Testament. When Jesus healed Peter, He did so over a beach-side meal cooked over a charcoal fire that Jesus built in miraculously short time (John 21:15-25). When God's people are called home, the event will be celebrated with a feast (Rev. 19:9)!

Do not underestimate how important it is share a meal with people. It is vital. *Devote* yourself to it and put up with all of the logistical inconveniences such a devotion to Christian fellowship brings. They are well worth it. So, humble yourself and break bread (v.46).



Transferring of Tithe/Offering via DBS/POSB banking platform

1) digibank Mobile

- Log in to digibank Mobile with your **Touch / Face ID** or **digibank User ID & PIN**.
- Tap **Pay & Transfer** and select **Local**.
- Select the **Recipient** you wish to transfer to: *(For Recipient's list refer to Add a Recipient)*
 - o SACC English Congregation 029-900919-2
 - o SACC Cambodia Mission Fund 106-900039-4
 - o SACC Growth Fund 106-900038-6
- Select the **Fund Source** you wish to transfer from (e.g. saving account) and enter the **Amount** you wish to transfer
- Enter your tithe number in **'Reference'**
- Tap **Next** to review the details, and tap **Transfer Now** to complete the transfer.

2) Via Paynow

- Select 'PAYNOW' in your banking app
- Bank will send you a 6 digits OTP
- Key in the UEN T08CC4074CEC1 / T08CC4074CCMF / T08CC4074CGF2
- Key in the amount to be transferred.
- Key in your Tithe number in the 'Reference' space
- Click 'Transfer'
- Bank will send a text message to you that the amount has been transferred.
- You can send this message to church office.

3) DBS/POSB ATM

- Insert your ATM/Debit Card and key in your PIN.
- Press Button for **More Services**.
- Press Button for "Funds Transfer/Fixed Deposit".
- Select the Account Type to Debit (your own bank account)
- Select the saving account type and number to Credit
 - o SACC (English) 029-900919-2
 - o SACC Cambodia Mission Fund 106-900039-4
 - o SACC Growth Fund 106-900038-6
- Enter the amount.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and press **Confirm**.
- Key in your tithe number under reference/bill or send a text to the church office of the transaction: Date of transfer; tithe & amount

4) digibank Online

- Open ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select **Transfer** and click **Other DBS or POSB Account**.
- Log in with your **6-Digit iB Secure PIN**.
- Choose the **Recipient** you wish to transfer your money to.
- Select the **Account** you wish to transfer from.
- Select the **Currency** and indicate the **Amount** you wish to transfer.
- Click **Next**.
- To transfer to a particular payee, you will need to have him/her in your recipient's list.

Adding a recipient to your list.

- Open the ibanking portal, login with your **User ID** and **PIN**.
- Select **Transfer** and click **Add New DBS or POSB Recipient** and complete the **Authentication Process**.
- Indicate the **Recipient's name** and **Account number**, click **Next**.
- Verify the **Details of the Transaction** and follow the **2-Factor Authentication Instructions**.
- Click **Submit** to complete the request.

Digibank Online allows you to set a monthly transfer on desired date.
Follow the instruction in the '**More Services**' button.
